## **Country Chicken Casserole**

I am a great fan of casseroles, easy to fix and able to make ahead of time. During these summer months I am experimenting with using my crock pot for the baking instead of putting the oven on. So far it is working out well – give it a try!

2 ½ lb chicken cut up in chunks

1 cup flour

Salt and pepper

1 Tbsp oil

2 Tbsp butter

12 small white onions

12 small peeled white potatoes (I like the Dutch Gold ones, unpeeled)

8 medium mushrooms, quartered

6 slices bacon fried until crisp

2 cups chicken stock

1 Tbsp cornstarch

2 Tbsp cold water

Chopped parsley

Season flour with salt and pepper, and dredge the chicken pieces in it. Heat the butter and oil in large skillet, and sauté chicken until evenly golden brown. Transfer to ovenproof casserole dish. Add onions and potatoes to skillet and cook until lightly browned, stirring gently to prevent sticking, and add to casserole. Place mushrooms in frying pan and cook for five minutes. Add to casserole with crumbled fried bacon and chicken broth. Cover and bake in 350 degree oven for one hour. Dissolve cornstarch in cold water and stir into casserole to thicken. Sprinkle with parsley. (If using the crock-pot, place the vegetables in the crock-pot first, then the chicken then rest of ingredients. Cook on low for 4-6 hours, thickening with the cornstarch mix just before serving)

# Florida Gardening by Nicholas Davis



Last month we covered the basics of lawn maintenance. Every month I'm going to give you a guide as to what you should be doing. This month I'm going to cover shrubs. Prune hedges when you have a few inches or so of growth, shearing them back to about an inch or two of the previous cuts. This allows the hedge to grow each time it's trimmed. Everything should be getting plenty of water from the rain this time of year, but if it's very dry, some watering may be needed. Rain has to fall at least a quarter of an inch to begin wetting the soil. When you water, give it at least

3/4 of an inch.

You can apply some fertilizer if some of the leaves are yellowing. Don't forget to use pesticides when destructive insects are getting out of control. Leaf spots are yellow to brown spots caused by fungal activity on leaves. The fungus attacks older leaves and they start to drop. Apply a fungicide where new and healthy leaves are infected, following the instructions on the label.

This is also a good time to add some plantings to your landscape such as Hibiscus which has large flowers and shrubs like Crotons which have exotic leaf colors and give a really tropical look. The heat will not be a problem for these plants. Just remember, for your sake, wear a hat and use plenty of sunscreen, or better still, try to work in the cooler hours of the day.

Start by preparing the soil, tilling as deep as possible. Work in lots of organic matter. Set the plants in the ground at the same depth they were growing in the pots. Build a 4 inch high berm of soil around the edge of the root ball to fill with water. Add some mulch and keep soil moist.


