Potato Cakes

Potato Cakes

4 rashers of bacon About 4 medium potatoes, cooked 1 Tbsp. chopped parsley 1 Tbsp. butter Dash of milk Salt and pepper to taste

Beat up potatoes, parsley, butter and milk. Fry up the bacon until crisp and then crumble into the potatoes. Cool, so you can handle, and form into six equal cakes. Fry in the bacon fat, browning both sides. Serves 6.
