### Strawberry Fool

Even after living in Florida for so many years, I still have difficulty relating fresh produce being available at opposite times from "up north." Right now, strawberries are really delicious and easily found. The nicest are from Plant City, but also there are several sources in Sarasota County. I thought a nice, easy dessert using strawberries would make a lovely Valentine treat. The word fool in this British recipe refers to a trifle or of little consequence, and goes back to the middle ages. However "trifling" it may seem, it is a lovely dessert for your sweetheart!

#### **Strawberry Fool**

1 lb. fresh strawberries, washed, dried and picked over for any spoiled bits

1-1/4 cup heavy whipping cream

1/4 cup sugar

1 tsp. vanilla (can also substitute rose water for a nice change)

Be sure the strawberries are clean and dried and that all spoiled bits are cut off. Place in a blender and puree. If needed at this point, you can strain to remove any seeds

Whip the cream until almost stiff, and beat in sugar and vanilla. Then fold into the pureed strawberries. Chill for at least four hours before serving.

### Stan's Sports Spot

**Soccer** Arsenal suffered their first-ever defeat at the Reebok Stadium as Bolton got their tactics spot on to severely damage their opponents' title hopes. Bolton's deserved win leaves Arsenal 10 points behind leaders Chelsea, who increased their lead with a 2-0 win in a classic London derby with Spurs. In the other classic match Liverpool goalkeeper Jerzy Dudek suffered a nightmare against a 10-man Manchester United as they secured a vital victory at Anfield. Dudek allowed Wayne Rooney's tame 25-yard shot to slide in after 22 minutes to gift the former Everton striker a goal in front of The Kop.



**Golf** Britain's Justin Rose fired a second-round 66 to trail leader Shigeki Maruyama by one shot in the US Tour's Sony Open in Hawaii. Rose surged to seven under alongside American Brett Quigley with Japan's Maruyama out in front after a 65 at the Waialae Country Club in Honolulu. World number one Vijay Singh edged to three under with a 68, while South African Ernie Els was a shot behind.

Cricket The fourth Test between South Africa and England hangs in the balance after England threw away a good advantage to end day four on 197-5. Marcus Trescothick hit his 10th Test century and put on 124 for the third wicket with Michael Vaughan (54). But England then crumbled from 172-2 as Vaughan, Graham Thorpe and Andrew Flintoff lost their wickets rapidly before bad light stopped play. Earlier South Africa scored 419 to give them an eight-run first-innings lead.





<u>F1</u> Toyota driver Jarno Trulli says he is confident their new car will be ready in time for the new Formula One season, which starts in Australia on 6 March. Trulli and teammate Ralf Schumacher have tested the new TF105 in Spain but were beaten by test driver Ricardo Zonta driving the old TF104B last week.
