Sandra's Recipe of the Month - Colcannon

Thought I would feature a traditional Irish dish, a yummy side dish to any meats. Potatoes are a staple of anyone's diet; by the way in my research I found out that the word 'spuds' for potatoes, is named after the tool once used in the potato patch! Another piece of worthless information you might find of interest!

Colcannon

6 large Idaho potatoes

½ green cabbage

1 small leek

1 bunch spring onions

4 tbsp butter

½ cup cream

Salt and pepper

½ tsp. nutmeg

Peel potatoes, cut into cubes, place in saucepan, cover with water and boil until cooked. Whilst potatoes are cooking, cut up cabbage until finely sliced. Clean leek and finely slice. Peel outer layer of onions, and finely chop. Melt 2 Tbsp butter in large pan and sauté cabbage about 5 minutes. Add leeks and onions, and sauté another 3-4 minutes. Drain cooked potatoes, and mash up, with remaining 2 Tbsp butter, and the cream. Add salt, pepper and nutmeg and whip until fluffy. Combine with cabbage and onion mixture in large pan, and gently reheat.
