I am a fan of Google's Picasa (a free download) for quick photo manipulation, I use it virtually every day in addition to my more sophisticated software. Recently I found more tricks for photos (and movies), rightly described as 'Auto Awesome' at <u>http://tinyurl.com/nkok7oa</u> as part of Google+ for those of you with a gmail account.

One of the coolest tricks is **Eraser**- If you take a sequence of 3 or more photos in front of a structure or landmark with movement in the background, Eraser will give you a photo with all the moving objects removed. It's helpful for those situations when you're trying to get a great shot of a landmark or other crowded place, but want to avoid including all of the people in the background of your photo.




