FRUITY BREAD AND BUTTER PUDDING

One of the fun things at our Board meetings, is our potluck we do after the official meeting. There are so many variations of the old fashioned bread and butter pudding, and we all bring luverly stuff, and this is one I concocted which all enjoyed....didn't go home with any of it! Thought I would share it after being asked for the recipe!

½ cup dried fruit (*I used apricots, sultanas, cranberrys*)

- 2 Tbsp Grand Marnier
- 3 Tbsp Chunky orange marmalade (I used half regular and half with ginger)
- 8 slices of good bread, crusts cut off

Grated rind of 1 orange, and juice

- 3 eggs
- 2 cups milk
- 3 Tbsp demerara sugar
- 3 Tbsp runny honey
- Roughly chop the dried fruits, and place in bowl, then pour over the Grand Marnier and let sit for one hour to marinate.
- Preheat the oven 350 F. Butter an ovenproof dish and smear the marmalade around the base and sides.
- Butter the slices of bread.
- Drain the fruit saving the liquid, add the orange juice and peel.
- Place the bread and fruit in the baking dish, distributing the fruit evenly between the slices of bread.
- Whisk the eggs with the milk and sugar in a bowl, add the soaking liquid, and pour over the layers of fruit and bread. Let stand for about 30 minutes.
- Drizzle the honey over the top of the pudding, and bake 40-60 minutes, until lightly set (test with a knife, should come away clean) leave to stand about 10-15 minutes before serving. Lovely served with pouring cream.


