Lancashire Hot Pot

Even though I know it is summer time (hard to tell in Florida!), I always enjoy a casserole of some sort; it is so easy to make ahead. Originally Lancashire Hot Pot included oysters, as they used to be so cheap and plentiful in Victorian times, and the original method to cook it was by standing up the lamb chops in a deep pot. However, just a regular casserole laying them flat works well, too. Hope you enjoy my version.

Lancashire Hot Pot

2 Tbsp butter

6 potatoes, peeled and cut into half inch slices

2 lb. best lean stewing lamb, or 8 best lamb chops

Salt and pepper

2 onions sliced thin

3 lamb kidneys, trimmed and cut small

1 cup beef broth

Melted butter

2 Tbsp chopped parsley

Grease a 1-2 quart casserole dish. Place a layer of ¾ of the potatoes, cover with the lamb and season with the salt and pepper. Cover with a layer of ½ the onion slices. Add the kidneys and remaining onion. Pour the beef broth over and brush the potatoes with melted butter. Cover and cook for two hours at 350 degrees. Remove the lid, return to the oven and then cook another 30 minutes. Sprinkle with parsley before serving.

- 2 June 1953: Queen Elizabeth takes coronation oath
- 3 June 1962: 130 die in Paris air crash
- 4 June 1940: Dunkirk rescue is over Churchill defiant
- **5 June 1963: Profumo resigns over sex scandal** Secretary of State for War, John Profumo, resigns admitting he lied to Parliament about his relationship with a call girl.
- 6 June 1944: D-Day marks start of Europe invasion
- **7 June 2000: Blair 'handbagged' by the WI** The UK prime minister is heckled and criticised by Women's Institute members as he gives a speech at their conference.
- **8 June** 1963: Ward charged over 'immoral earnings' Dr. Stephen Ward, a London osteopath and friend of Christine Keeler, is arrested and charged with living on immoral earnings
- **9 June 1975: First live broadcast of Parliament** The first live transmission from the House of Commons is broadcast by BBC Radio and commercial stations.
- **9 June 1958: Queen opens revamped Gatwick** The Queen has opened an extended airport at Gatwick, south of London, modernised at a cost of £7m.
- **10 June 1977: Killer perch outwitted by electric rod** An elusive goldfish-eating perch with a prodigious appetite is finally netted after two years on the rampage in a Kent pond.
- **11 June 1959: Hovercraft marks new era in transport** The Hovercraft invented by Christopher Cockerell is officially launched in Southampton.
- **11 June 1987: Thatcher wins record third term** Margaret Thatcher declares she is "raring to go" as she wins a record third term as prime minister.
- **12 June 1986: Labour expels Militant Hatton** Derek Hatton, the controversial deputy leader of Liverpool Council, is thrown out of the Labour Party for belonging to the leftwing Militant faction.
- **13 June 1981: Queen shot at by youth** A 17-year-old man is arrested for shooting a replica gun at the Queen as she rode past crowds in London.
- **14 June 1982: Ceasefire agreed in Falklands** A ceasefire between British and Argentine forces on the Falkland Islands is agreed, the prime minister announces.
- **15 June 1966: Hovercraft deal opens show** The world's first hovershow opens in Britain with news of a Ministry of Defence order worth £1m.
- **16 June 1992: Controversial Diana book published** An explosive new book about the Princess of Wales, including claims she attempted suicide, is published by author Andrew Morton.
- **17 June 1974: IRA bombs parliament** A bomb explodes at the Houses of Parliament, causing extensive damage and injuring 11 people.
- **18 June 1972: UK's worst air crash kills 118** A flight from London Heathrow to Brussels crashes minutes after take-off killing all 118 people on board.
- **19 June 1975: Missing earl guilty of murder** An inquest jury decides Lord Lucan murdered the 29-year-old nanny of his three young children.

- **19 June 1982: 'God's banker' found hanged** Roberto Calvi, a senior Italian banker, is found dead under Blackfriars Bridge in London more than a week after he went missing from Milan.
- **20 June 1990: Major proposes new Euro currency** British Chancellor John Major proposes a new European currency which would circulate alongside existing national currencies.
- **20 June 1984: O-Levels to be replaced by GCSEs** The biggest exam shake-up for over 10 years is announced with O-Level and CSE exams to be replaced by a new exam.
- **21 June 1982: Princess Diana gives birth to boy** Diana, Princess of Wales, gives birth to a boy sixteen hours after checking in to St Mary's Hospital, in London.
- **22 June 1981: Chapman pleads guilty to Lennon murder** Mark Chapman changes his plea to guilty and admits he murdered John Lennon in December 1980.
- **22 June 1959: Harrods in £34m merger talks** Directors of Harrods are urging shareholders to vote for a merger with Debenhams department chain.
- **23 June 1955: Queen Elizabeth sails on schedule** The Queen Elizabeth ocean liner leaves for New York on schedule despite attempts by striking seamen to delay her departure.
- **23 June 1972: Chancellor orders pound flotation** The Chancellor, Anthony Barber, announces his decision to temporarily float the pound.
- **24 June 1968: Rail go-slow begins** The country's rail network is thrown into disarray as the National Union of Railwaymen begins its work-to-rule and ban on overtime.
- **24 June 1993: Minister resigns over business links** Northern Ireland Minister Michael Mates resigns over his links with fugitive tycoon Asil Nadir.
- **25 June 1953: Christie to hang for wife's murder** John Christie is sentenced to hang for murdering his wife and then hiding her body under the floorboards of their Notting Hill home in London.
- **26 June 1970: Violence flares as Devlin is arrested** Riots break out in Londonderry after it is revealed Bernadette Devlin has been arrested.
- **26 June 1959: Queen and Eisenhower open seaway** The Queen and President Eisenhower inaugurate the St Lawrence Seaway in Canada that connects the Great Lakes to the Atlantic.
- **27 June 1977: Home Secretary jeered on picket line** Home Secretary Merlyn Rees appeals for calm following two weeks of violent clashes outside the Grunwick factory in north London.
- **28 June 1991: Thatcher to retire from Commons** Margaret Thatcher is to give up her seat in the House of Commons at the general election.
- 29 June 1960: BBC unveils TV 'factory' The BBC's new Television Centre will be the "Hollywood" of the small screen, the corporation's director of TV announces.
