#### **Salmon and Asparagus Flan**

Well happy summer all!! I know we don't want to spend ages cooking and using an oven now for a bit, so thought I would feature my Salmon and Asparagus Flan recipe, similar to a quiche for a light supper or lunch. It was adapted from a recipe on a can of Tesco's tinned salmon that dear Pauline Richards brought back from England when she was helping me in the tea room. It is so easy and good, can be made ahead, freezes well, and baked in the microwave if you don't want to use the oven. (*Canned salmon is best for this recipe.*)

Shortcrust Pastry

1 - 14 ¾ oz can red salmon

½ lb blanched asparagus tips

3/4 cup milk

½ cup cream

Salt and Pepper

4 eggs ½ cup grated cheddar cheese

Roll out the pastry and line a lightly greased pie pan or quiche dish. Flake salmon with a fork and spread over the prepared pastry shell, arrange asparagus tips over that. Beat eggs, milk and cream, add salt and pepper, pour over and bake 10 minutes at 400 degrees. Lower heat to 325 degrees, sprinkle with the cheese and bake a further 40 minutes or until set. Good hot or cold. (If using a microwave, bake at 75-80 power or until centre sets, about 15 minutes, depending on microwave oven)

Serves 6



#### THE CASE OF THE NOISY PEUGEOT

"I feel sorry for you, all dressed up like a Christmas tree", said the Government Printer, as he greeted me in his office in Zomba, Nyasaland (now Malawi). He looked comfortably cool in his colonial civil servant's uniform of khaki open-necked shirt, shorts and knee-length socks. By contrast, I was wearing the usual attire of a 1960's era Alex Pirie sales representative: jacket, long trousers, shirt, tie and highly polished black shoes.

It all seemed, and was, a long way from London where I had started what was to become a life-long career in the paper industry. In 1957 my new wife Audrey and I emigrated to Salisbury, Southern Rhodesia (now Harare, Zimbabwe). There I joined Alex Pirie (Rhodesia) Pvt. Ltd., part of a worldwide company.

At that time, mid-1957, Salisbury was the fastest growing city in Southern Africa. The staff consisted of twelve "Europeans" and twelve Africans. Our market was extensive, covering not only S. Rhodesia but also Mozambique, Angola and what was then known as the Belgian Congo. A branch had just been opened in Ndola, Northern Rhodesia.

In 1957, Salisbury, which was settled in 1890, had a population of 70,000 "Europeans" and 175,000 Africans. Interestingly, in 1945, the white population numbered about 11,000. However, from that point on, population growth was fuelled by R.A.F. men who had trained in Rhodesia during World War II and had returned with families and friends to seek a better life and climate.

Harry Pryke, one of our two outside sales representatives, initially covered Nyasaland as part of his territory. When the branch manager asked me to take over this area, little did I know that every trip would involve some sort of minor adventure. Nyasaland is just a little larger than Scotland with nearly a third of its area occupied by Lake Nyasa. In 1957, the population totaled two and a half million, including 56,000 whites and 6,000 Asians (mostly Indians).
