Diana's Cabbage and Apple

This is an interesting cabbage recipe instead of the over-cooked boiled version my mother used to serve up! It is lovely with pork, or even fish.

INGREDIENTS

Butter
Half large cabbage or one small cabbage
1 large chopped onion
2-3 teaspoons of Caraway Seeds
1 cup white wine
2-3 tablespoons brown sugar
Juice of half a lemon
2 sour or sweet apples
2-3 tablespoons cider vinegar to taste
Salt and pepper



INSTRUCTIONS

In a large flat frying pan:-
Melt butter and sauté onion until soft
Add chopped apple, lemon juice, sugar and caraway seeds
Toss gently until apple is soft
Add vinegar, cabbage and wine
Cover and steam for about 10 minutes until cabbage is soft, but don't over cook!
Serve and enjoy....



Guided Tour of the Gamble Mansion

Friday March 11 @ 10.30 a.m.

Entrance fee \$6.00 per adult (payable at the gate)

*T*his antebellum mansion was home to Major Robert Gamble and headquarters of an extensive sugar plantation. It is the only surviving plantation house in South Florida.

Gamble Plantation Historic State Park

Essential Eligibility Criteria *Guided Tour - Gamble Mansion*

In order to participate in this program, one:

- Must have the ability to follow visual and/or verbal instructions independently or with the assistance of a companion.
- Must have the ability to withstand exposure to the outdoors for a period of 60 minutes.
- Must have the ability to traverse uneven terrain for up to 60 yards.
- Must have the ability to traverse a wooden ramp at an incline of 5 degrees for 8 feet or climb 2 steps 6 inches high with a tread width of 11 inches, independently or with the assistance of a companion. (First Floor)
- Must have the ability to climb 17 steps that are 7 inches high with a tread width of 11 inches, independently or with the assistance of a companion. (Second Floor)


We will have a picnic lunch afterward, tables are available. BYOP (bring your own picnic)
