Sarasota Ballet Backstage Tour

en Club members and one guest participated in a backstage experience on St. Valentines Day, February 14 at the Florida State University Center for the Performing Arts. We were welcomed by the Yorkshire born Ballet Director, Iain Webb, who shared insights into the unique world of ballet accompanied by his personal collection of mementos validating his British heritage. The tour highlight was a stop in Studio 1 where we were charmed by the warms words of greeting from the Ballet Master while the dance ensemble in colorful warm-ups stepped through their adagio movements Added insights were formed in the maze of studios and hallways where racks and towers of colorful tutus and piles of toe shoes at \$100 a pair are stored (performers are known to go through three pairs per performance!). An encounter with the Head of Wardrobe at his work station provided a glimpse into his stunning array of garments, sewing machines, scissors, threads and boxes of costume trinkets and accessories. A visit to the Education Department revealed a series of 'all-ages' programs for three year olds to adults with a particular emphasis on the Dance Next Generation program, which offers a 10 year long study of dance for at-Upon successful high school risk local students. graduation full scholarships to near-by higher education institutions are offered.

The tour concluded with a brief visit to the adjoining Asolo Repertory Theatre followed by a delightful lunch at the Muse Restaurant. Mark Malkasian 2/15/'17

Sad News

orn in Brooklyn on March 3, 1932, Edwin Solomon was especially proud of his English roots. His Grandfather had owned a lemonade company in London and after serving in the Signal Corps, his father emigrated to New York. There, he met Ed's mother, whose family emigrated from Russia when she was just eight months old.



Ed, as he was known by all, had worked in several professions over the years and be-

came a self-made millionaire. He was a buyer for his parents' drug store, owned 2 dress shops with his brother and was a chauffeur for Tina Louise (of Gilligan's Island) and her father. He visited the Apollo Theatre every Saturday, where he saw Pearl Bailey and Marilyn Munroe when she was married to Jo Di-Maggio. Ed met other artists at a restaurant next to the Apollo, which was owned by his friend's parents.

Along with other performers, he managed Bill Monroe, who created the style of music known as bluegrass. He knew Lead Belly, Pete Seeger, Arlo Guthrie and many other artists personally; and was a country and bluegrass radio announcer for stations in the south-central region of the U.S.

He was there in Washington Square Park when Bob Dylan sold the song "Blowing In The Wind" to Peter, Paul and Mary. He was there when Dean Martin and Frank Sinatra surprised Sammy Davis Jr. on stage and he attended the funeral of Paul Robeson.

In addition to bluegrass and folk music, Ed also loved the classics. Mozart, Beethoven and Bach were his favourite classical composers and although he didn't like the music of Dmitri Shostakovich very much, he did get to meet the Russian pianist and composer at a party.

He was a very kind and interesting man and his passion for music led him to all seven continents more than once in search of it. In fact, music was what led him to me. He wanted to attend the Eisteddfod but his previous travel agent had no idea where it was and since he spoke with me often at Club events, he asked me to assist him. It took a plane, two trains, a bus ride and a lift from the bus stop by the hotel owner, but he attended and had a wonderful time. Since then, he had become a treasured client and friend.

Ed kept in constant contact with his British family and visited family members throughout England whenever there was a Bar Mitzvah, Bat Mitzvah or any special occasion. He would always say to people he met, "I don't play golf so I spend my money on travel" and so he spent his life doing what he loved best, traveling and listening to music.

He will be missed by many. *Sioux Faragher-Hurley*

Kayak Trip on Siesta Key

Monday, March 27, 2017 from the launch A link to more photos is on Page 3 point at Turtle Beach Park at 8919 Midnight Pass Rd. on South Siesta Key

Arrival time is not later than 8:30AM; Launch time is 9AM.

Directions: from Rt 41 in Sarasota take Stickney Point Rd heading west toward Siesta Key // cross over the waterway bridge // at the signal light turn left onto Midnight Pass Rd // travel 2.5 miles to Turtle Beach Road and turn right // proceed a short distance to Blind Pass Rd // turn left and see the launch point to your left on the water off the dirt lot // park on either side of Blind Pass Rd and walk to the launch point.

The Tour is a three-hour trip around the Neville Wildlife Preserve on Little Sarasota Bay. Unlike our prior kayak trips we will not have benefit of our usual guide with the American Littoral Society. This trip is booked with a well -established, local, commercial outfitter that supplies all the necessary equipment but no guide. NOTICE. This will be a self-guided tour but I will be with you all the way — laminated map in hand. I will not have a waiver form for participants to sign, and I will not assume responsibility for skill levels or situations and conditions on the water.

Restrooms are not available during the trip although we will have one leg stretch stop.

Seat Availability: 14 boats are available in any combination of singles or doubles. Since our initial announcement of this event in January we have had nine kayaks booked leaving five kayaks in whatever combinations of sizes to fill out our fleet.

Bring your own personal protection gear e.g. water, sun screen, headgear, wet-water foot wear and snacks etc. and also bring \$28 in cash for each single sit-on-top kayak or \$40 for each double sit-on-top kayak. Checks or credit cards bump fees up to \$29.96 and \$42.80 respectively. No payments are to be sent to SBC or the Event Coordinator (EC), Mark Malkasian. Lunch is planned at Turtle's (<u>http://www.turtlesrestaurant.com</u>) Restaurant rectly opposite your turn onto Turtle Beach Road. Reservations will be made if you indicate you wish to join us. Please contact the EC via margmalk@gmail.com or phone 445-2890 to book your kayak preference, your seat at lunch and/or if you have questions.


