The Bylaw Committee met on February 23 to continue the work on rewriting the club's bylaws. A bit of a daunting task, but the bylaws are very much in need of updating. The proposed changes will be presented to the board for approval at the March 7 meeting, and then to the membership for their approval.

Most of our annual running costs do not vary much each year, however, we have included the cost of officially changing the club name this year and doubled the allowance for envelopes and stamps as we plan to send welcome letters to new members, and membership solicitation letters to guests who attend some of the main events. We have increased the cost of the newsletter because we plan to put 30 copies in three different pubs each month in the hope of increasing membership. Many of the planned events show a zero cost. This is because there will be no cost to the club or because we will be charging members a fee and plan to break even.

Our expected income for 2006, if dues and membership remain the same, would be \$2,040. Obviously this is not enough to cover expenses. The board discussed increasing membership dues in January and was hoping to keep them the same, but it appears this cannot be. A small increase of \$5 in dues would solve this problem, and the board believes this would be acceptable to the membership as dues have not been increased since the club began.

Hot Drinks for Cool Nights

Hot Wine Punch

- 1 ½ cups boiling water
- 1 small can lemonade concentrate
- 1 sliced orange

½ cup sugar

- 6 whole allspice
- 12 whole cloves
- 4 sticks cinnamon
- 3 cups Burgundy wine

Put all ingredients except the wine into a large saucepan, bring to boil and simmer 10 minutes. Add the Burgundy wine, and simmer 10 minutes more. Serves 8-10.



Hot Mulled Cider

6 cups apple cider (or apple juice)

- 2 Tbsp honey
- 1 Tbsp brown sugar
- 8 lemon slices
- 2 whole cloves
- 8 cinnamon sticks

(Golden Rum)



Put all ingredients in a large saucepan and bring to boil, simmer 5 minutes. When ready to serve, put 3 Tbsp golden rum into 1 cup heated mug, and add cider mix. For hot buttered cider, add small pat of butter into each drink, stir until melted. Serves 8
