Leek Pie

I thought I would feature a Welsh dish this month in honour of St. David's Day on the 1st. Wales is such a pretty spot, with many striking areas and castles. Since the leek is the national emblem, here is my version of Leek Pie, which is traditionally served on St. David's' Day.

2 cups all purpose flour ½ lb lean bacon, Danish or Irish if you can get it

34 cup shortening 34 cup whipping cream

1 tsp salt 3 beaten eggs
1/3 cup chilled water salt and pepper
2/3 cup cleaned and chopped leeks ½ tsp nutmeg

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. Make pastry: Cut shortening into flour and salt, mix in water and make into a soft dough. Roll out and fit into a greased pie dish. Mix remaining ingredients and pour into prepared pastry shell. Bake 30-40 minutes. Serves 4-6
