Well, Italy might be too far away, but we have found a vineyard where we can do all of the above right in our own backyard.

Rosa Tiorelli Minery, Jne. & Tiorelli Vineyard

We have reserved the Rosa Fiorelli Winery in Bradenton for the afternoon of Sunday, June 3^d from 2:00 to 5:00 p.m. In a special covered pavilion amidst the vineyards, we will sample some 7 to 10 locally different produced wines, eat an Italian meal (buffet style) and learn about the delicate science of wine. We will also get making a chance to see the grapes just before they are harvested (mid-June) and tour the facility where

the wine is actually made. This is a small, rustic winery which is owner-operated. If desired, wine can also be purchased to take home.

Reservations are a must for this event and the deadline for signing up is Saturday, May 19th. The cost is just \$25 per person, which includes the tour, lunch and wine tasting. The Arcadian Experience

Arcadia, as any student of world civilizations will tell you, was a district of ancient Greece. The area was isolated from the coast, surrounded on all sides by high mountains. Arcadians lived a simple life -- almost pastoral -- untouched by the progress that marked the rest of Greece at the time. The name Arcadia thus came to be a symbol of ideal simplicity, rural beauty, and contentment.

Mention Arcadia to local residents, however, and thoughts turn to a small hamlet some distance east of us, rodeos, country life. Having spent some time in Arcadia, it seems evident to me that the town's founding fathers clearly had the Grecian counterpart in mind when they named the area.

There's an overwhelming sense of serenity as one approaches the town, owing in part to the beauty of the countryside and the friendliness of the people. How apropos, then, that Arcadia should also serve as the final resting spot for twenty-three members of Her Majesty's Royal Air Force killed during training exercises on our shores during World War II.

Each year on Memorial Day the Arcadian Rotary and the local American Legion honor the memory of those 23 courageous young men and their American instructor who so innocently perished while training to defend their homeland.

Well over 100 people attend this around the world are delivered to cemetery. Wreaths come from the Canadian Government, as organizations including British, from Clearwater to Naples.

Turn left and follow that road into the cemetery. Drive straight back and look for the Union Jack flying over the British Plot.


