Old Fashioned Bread Pudding

There are many variations of bread and butter pudding, but I recently had a request for bread pudding, which is more dense, but still good. It might make an alternative choice for the upcoming holidays. Hope you enjoy my version.

Old Fashioned Bread Pudding

1/2 lb brown or white bread (I like to mix both)
1 1/4 cup milk
3 Tbsp melted butter
1/3 cup brown sugar
1 Tbsp all/mixed spice
1 beaten egg
2/3 cup mixed currants and raisins
Grated nutmeg

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Butter a casserole dish. Cut crusts off bread and break into small pieces; place in a bowl. Pour milk over, mix well and let stand for 30 minutes until well soaked. Add melted butter, sugar, spice and beaten egg. Using a fork, beat mixture up until no lumps are left, then stir in dried fruit. Spread into prepared casserole dish and sprinkle with nutmeg. Bake for 1-1/4 hours. Serve sliced with custard sauce or cream. Yield 4 servings.
