Cauliflower Cheese

1 medium cauliflower broken into flowerets

2 Tbsp butter

2 Tbsp flour

1 ½ cups milk

1 cup grated sharp cheddar cheese

Dash nutmeg and Tabasco sauce

4 Tbsp breadcrumbs

Cook cauliflower in salted water about 10 minutes, or until almost tender, don't overcook! Drain well and put in medium ovenproof dish. Melt butter in saucepan, stir in the flour and gradually add the milk stirring until smooth. Stir in ¾ cup of the cheese, nutmeg and Tabasco. Stir until thickened about two minutes. Pour over the partially cooked cauliflower and sprinkle with the remaining cheese and breadcrumbs. Bake in a 400 degree oven for five minutes. Serves 4

Named Andrew Albert Christian Edward, he was known as Prince Andrew until his marriage, when he was created The Duke of York, Earl of Inverness and Baron Killyleagh.
