Turn left onto Sarasota Central Parkway, cross McIntosh Road and Stoneybrook is about a 2-3 block distance further down on the right-hand side. ..or.... (2) Take Interstate 75 south to Clark Road. Go right (west) on Clark to McIntosh (4th light). Turn left onto McIntosh until you reach Sarasota Central Parkway (about 3 miles). Turn left and and Stoneybrook is about a 2-3 block distance further down on the right-hand side.

Lemon Curd

This is such a favourite, and really easy to make, I had forgotten how good this is when home made, when I sampled some from the W.I. last year when in England. You will need to refrigerate this after making it and use within a couple of weeks. You can also make orange curd by substituting the lemons with oranges.

Lemon Curd

3 large lemons 1 cup sugar

5 eggs 1 stick (8 tbsp.) melted butter

Finely grate the lemon rind, and squeeze the juice from the lemon. Save, removing the seeds by putting through a sieve. Place the rind and lemon in a food processor or blender, and slowly add the melted butter. Put the mixture into a heavy saucepan and cook about 5 minutes over medium heat just until thickened. Place in clean containers and chill.
