Remembrance of John Barton Cherry



November 5, 1930-April 6, 2017

ohn Barton Cherry (Jack) died peacefully on April 6th, 2017 surrounded by family at The Springs Nursing Home in Sarasota. Born in Minnesota on November 5, 1930, Jack lived for many years in Wisconsin before moving his family to Sarasota in 1985.

Jack served in the U.S. Army during the Korean War. After that service and exploring several other avenues, Jack discovered his true calling as an instructor for many years at the Kenosha/Elkhorn Technical Institute in Wisconsin (now known as The Gateway Technical College).

Following the Cherry family's move to Sarasota, Jack drove for S.C.A.T; and after retirement, helped Sandra with her tea-room and catering business in Gulf Gate.

On the lighter side, Jack sang with the Snap-On male chorus in Kenosha, Wisconsin and also with wife, Sandra, in several performances of "The Messiah" by the Sarasota Choral Society.

Jack is survived by loving wife, Sandra after 51 years of a wonderful marriage, his daughter, Helen Cherry, and son, Ian Cherry, both of Sarasota; and grandsons Trevor Monte of Sarasota, and Colin Monte of Wimauma, Wisconsin.

Jack will be remembered as a kind and loving man with a sparkling sense of humour and well-loved by all. A celebration of Jack's life will be held on Sunday 30th April at 2 p.m. at the Camelot Lakes Club House (off Gantt Road).


