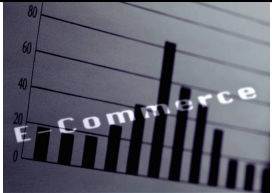

## Supplement to February 2011— BUSINESS GLIMPSES:

**The “4 & 20 Pasty Company”** – bringing cheers to the British community.

Opened in 2003, this haven for British taste has been a quiet success story in the history of British business in Sarasota.

Created by Richard & Barbara Posner. Who after 13 years in paradise still couldn't find the flavours and favourite foods they missed to make Florida perfect. So they decided to make it right.

R & B emigrated to FL in 1990, after many visits since 1974 and an “all around America” year in 1979 . After creating, and ultimately selling, a very popular Pizza, Pasta, Salad Bar & Cocktail Bar restaurant in the heart of the West End of London in the 80's. The laid-back style & slowly developing Gulf Coast (at the time) was as attractive a possibility for the good life as anywhere in the world. They'd been fortunate to travel a lot over the years. But the “Facility of English Speaking Peoples” was as much a draw as the palm & orange trees. What could be better after years of the urban battleground – taxes, aggro, parking, stress and 11 months of drizzle. So now for “something completely different”... and they didn't need to learn a foreign language. (Sometimes have musings on that, but hey!)

First off (after a 3 month rest) a marine business. Maintain, service and play with other peoples exotic toys. For money! With an American partner, who knew it all.

Not so perfect. The partner didn't really know the potential customers he claimed. It was a titanic struggle to build a list of clients. And it was so hot in the summer it hurt! So that burned out in its first year... literally.

Next step... a distribution company, SaraMana Wholesale, on Cattlemen Road, providing supplies, paper goods and hardware to the hospitality business. Worked great, had a lot of fun with customers. Familiarising themselves with the Sarasota Restaurant & Bar scene. But the products got too boring. So that was sold on, successful, in 2001. It's now a part of the Dade Paper Corp.

Then they had the 420 brainwaves in early 2003.

Why doesn't someone open a decent “British Bakery”. Something really good. Britfoods to be proud of, and providing some of the things all of us miss. Maybe they could also interest Americans, who seem to really enjoy Brit foods in pubs. Look what they've been missing!

They found a logo image they liked – ‘Old King Cole’ with his 24 black birds baked in a Pie (see below right) - and as their home address was number 420, the karma seemed right on.

That's how 4 & 20 Pasty Co. was conceived.

“Born in England - Made in America”.

And they opened the doors in October 2003.

The retail Hot & Frozen bakery was the first step. Made by hand from scratch, freshly baked and Take Home, hot or frozen, or eaten in store - inside or out. It was an instant success, attracting Brits... and Americans from the ore mining areas familiar with Pasties - Michigan, Colorado, Pennsylvania etc.

## 4 & 20 Pasty Company (continued)

Did you know thousands of Cornish tin miners came to America in the 1850's? Brought their wives, and they brought their pasties? The Upper Peninsula of Michigan is full of Pasty shops. Many 'Michiganders' winter on this coast.

Then the word was spread wider with the website they had built. They initially had snowbird customers, who had goodies sent by Fed-Ex when they went back up north. Then Google & Union Jack newspaper advertising helped 4 & 20 spread the word around many of America's British communities. Repeats and recommendations boosted sales.

Enquiries to stock the 4 & 20 Pasty Co. brand from Brit Stores & Gourmet Groceries started to come in. So they became licensed by the Federal USDA to make meat & chicken pies and started to ship Interstate.

They now have 4 & 20 stockists in 7 States, plus more enquiries every month. With a wonderful reputation. Expansion plans are now in the pipeline.

The “cheers” come from the 20 varieties of Pasties, varieties of Sausage Rolls to ‘die for’ (quoted by customers, but not recommended!), and the best traditional Pork Pies in America (“As good as “M & S” is a regular comparison). Exceptional Pork Sausages & decent Back Bacon was another area solved, combing the States for the very best Brit inspired products available.

The best thing since British sliced bread?

Which they've also got – frozen, both white & brown!

Long may they reign.
