

On Your PC



Do you ever use the 'Windows' key?

On most keyboards there are 2 of them in the front row printed with the Microsoft Windows logo.

This key can be used to provide useful shortcuts . Try these out. The first 3 of these are my favourites.

[Window Key] + [D] = shows the Desktop. This acts as a toggle to return to your previous task.

This is an alternative to clicking on the tiny icon that is often bottom left of the screen

[Window Key] + [E] = shows Explorer (My Computer)

This is an alternative is to clicking on the [My Computer] icon on the desktop,

or Click [Start].....My Computer or just Computer on later versions of Windows

[Window Key] + [F] = FIND

This is an alternative to clicking on [Start] ...[Search]

or Click Search when using Windows Explorer

[Window Key] + [U] = Shut PC down then [U] or [Enter] (Alternative to clicking Start>Shut down > Shut down).

On Windows Vista this has changed to bring up the Ease of Access Center

[Window Key] + [L] = Logs you off

[Window Key] + [R] = Brings up the 'Run' entry box for more experienced users.
