
September Board Meeting Precis from September 8th, 2011



Sarasota real estate is moving towards normalcy....
A steady drop in property inventory for sale, combined with a stable sales demand in the Sarasota real estate market, is pointing toward normal, healthy property appreciation in the coming months. We can clearly see the normal market forces of



supply and demand as Sarasota is becoming a seller's market, in which price appreciation would be expected.

An analysis of sales, prices and inventory figures reflects a market in recovery, led by a declining pool of available properties. Sales have been dropping for the past nine months, and hit another decade-low figure in August 2011. As a likely result of consumer demand and dropping inventory, the median sale price for single family homes and condos has recovered from the lows reached in February 2011. The latest monthly figures in August showed a median price of \$165,000 for both single family homes and condos - a 23 percent improvement from the lows of only seven months ago. The median sales prices were about 6.5 percent higher than last year at this time.

The local market is mirroring the national picture to some extent. In August, the total inventory of available properties dropped again to the lowest level in more than a decade. The current figure represents an astonishing drop from the high of 17,102 properties on the market in March 2007. With only a quarter of the properties on the market compared to four years ago, competition for properties has been dramatically increased, and agents are now fielding multiple bids on many properties.

The months of inventory dropped slightly to 6.3 months for single family homes, from last month's figure of 6.4 months. The 6 month level is traditionally a point which represents equilibrium in the market between buyers and sellers.

In some price ranges, the available inventory is even tighter. For example, combining single family homes and condos priced under \$200,000, there were 350 sales last month, and there are 1,653 properties available under that price, or 4.7 months of inventory. This number represents a clear seller's market, in which bidding competition and price appreciation would be expected.

For properties priced under \$350,000, most price ranges are indicating a seller's market has returned. This is in marked contrast to three years ago, when a buyer's market was in full force. The overall percentage of distressed sales (foreclosures and short sales) rose slightly in August 2011 to 41.2 percent from the 38 percent figure in July 2011. That compares to 47 percent as recently as February 2011 and a high of 51 percent in November 2010.

GBP/USD September update

High and low GBP/USD exchange rates in September: High: 1.6206USD, Low: 1.5329USD

The unresolved and intensifying euro zone debt crisis has increased volatility in financial markets and has led to further US dollar strength.

The Federal Open Market Committee (FOMC) announced last week that it will sell \$400bn in short-term treasuries, in order to purchase an equivalent amount of longer-term treasuries with remaining maturities of 6-30 years. This decision had been broadly expected, but did little to convince the markets a turnaround in the economy would come any time soon.

On the other side of the pond, the Bank of England's Quarterly Bulletin suggested that the UK's QE policy was a considerable success. Whether correct or not, the market has interpreted this as part of a communiqué that more QE is on its way, which could be viewed as either GBP-negative or reassuring that the bank stands ready for action, depending on your side of the fence.

The US dollar is likely to remain in demand against the euro and pound during this uncertain period. The direction of the dollar will largely depend on how euro zone leaders and the International Monetary Fund deal with the debt crisis in Europe and whether the markets view it with optimism or scepticism.

Power of Attorney: A written legal document that gives an individual the authority to act for another person pursuant to financial or real estate transactions.

If the only Power of Attorney that you have is the one that you executed back yonder in England then you might think that this is sufficient to cover your assets in Florida (i.e., bank accounts, property, etc). To a certain extent you are correct in your thinking, however, one must first obtain an official stamped Apostille (a verification of authenticity) and have this attached to the English Power of Attorney before any such US authority would even consider the document's validity. Even then the official Apostille does not guarantee that the US authorities will accept the Power of Attorney.



Such rejection of acceptance can prove incredibly difficult for the individual and family involved: one recent case of an expatriate father and his 'foreign' Power of Attorney with an attached Apostille being rejected by Floridian authorities led to a protracted Guardianship case. Such case involved numerous legal costs and untold difficulties for the children who were back in England.

Such difficulties could easily have been avoided if the father had also made a state specific Power of Attorney so as to ensure the validity and enforceability in the State of Florida. It is further recommended to the expatriate that such document is drafted in such a way so as not to unintentionally revoke the Power of Attorney in England.


