In Memoriam: Anne Wolfe

Anne E. Wolfe, 80, died after an extended stay at the Lakewood Ranch Medical Center on September 16, 2019. The cause of death, in part, was stage three Ovarian Cancer.

Anne was born in Cambridge, England, on June 22, 1939, the daughter of Leslie and Louisa Richards. She married Dr Michael Wolfe on January 7, 1964, in Baltimore, Maryland and spent 42 years working for the American Express Company (AMEX) in accounting, retail, and business services, and received numerous outstanding performance awards throughout her career.

Shore Birds Nesting Season

During this past summer, the birds, once again returned to nest in our beaches and there were colonies in Lido, Siesta and Longboat Key.

The Black Skimmers had a very productive year; the count in August was: 784 adults, 327 nests and 322 fledged chicks.

The Least Terns had two ground nesting colonies with a total of: 204 adults, 111 nests and 80 fledged chicks.

The Snowy Plovers sadly, had low numbers and no productivity: there were at most 3 breeding pairs and 7 nests which were lost due to ghost crabs, overwash and crows.

By now, the Black Skimmers have spread out leaving Lido and the Least Terns have made their way to South America for the winter; instead, we are seeing our migratory wintering species arrive, like Sanderlings, Ruddy Turnstones, Black Bellied Plovers and Willets.
