On the movie front I hope that members have been able to see two movies on the Big Screen at your local cinema.

- *Ford vs Ferrari* is a very American movie telling the story of how Ford challenged Ferrari's dominance in motor racing in the early 60's.
  - There are two British connections: one is that the lead driver of the Ford car was Ken Miles, from Birmingham, who is played by Brit Christian Bale; the other is that one of the two editors, *Drew Buckland*, is the son of Club members Mike and Linda Buckland. Drew and Michael McCusker have already won multiple awards for their work on 'Ford vs Ferrari' and have also been nominated for an Oscar and Bafta awards; we wish them luck at the upcoming ceremonies.
- The other British movie is 1917, directed by Sam Mendes and telling the story of the terrible war in the trenches during the Great War. It, too, is nominated for several Oscars.

On *Acorn* we have been enjoying *Finding Faith*, a tv series originally shot in Welsh, and set in the beautiful countryside around Carmarthen. Solid acting, although the plot is somewhat contrived.

On *Amazon* I highly recommend *Our Man in Japan. James May* (*Top Gear*, *Grand Tour*) provides an entertaining and amusing insight into Japan's geography and culture. The photography is outstanding, and his witty comments will pass you by if you do not pay attention.
