We 'cut the cord' a year ago and our TV viewing consists entirely of the following internet based apps:

PBS – for a \$5 monthly donation we have access to WEDU live tv for the nightly BBC World news at 6:00 pm. Most of the popular TV shows are available on demand, including All Creatures Great and Small, Nova, Antiques Roadshow and Masterpiece Theater. Great value!

Netflix – some recent good shows – **The Greatest Night of Pop** (making of the We are the World single in 1983), **The Tourist**, **The Night Agent**, **Fool Me Once**, and of course, **The Crown**. The first five series of **Outlander** are highly recommended, too!

Amazon – we seem to be watching this channel quite a lot, partly because we subscribe to **BritBox** within it. This latter channel is worthwhile for an endless series of Escape to the Country, and all 80+ episodes of **Dad's Army** – which stands the test of time surprisingly well.

Its worth paying on Amazon for some of the shows that originate on other channels, and we have enjoyed **Happy Valley**, **Luther**, **Yellowstone**, and **Fargo** (this latter has 5 series of dramas in a similar vein to the original movie and I highly recommend them). We also paid for the **Taylor Swift** concert, which was outstanding! On the Amazon **Prime** channel we have recently enjoyed **James May in India**, Yesterday (excellent if you like the Beatles), **The Tudors**, **Reacher**, and many more.

HBO-Max – if you haven't seen **Barbie** I recommend that you do, it's great fun! Max is known for outstanding drama series, including **Deadwood**, **Game of Thrones**, **The Gilded Age**, **Big Little Lies**, **The Sopranos**, **Chernobyl** etc. All of these are worth watching a second time. And there are a TON of outstanding movies that are well worth a second look.
